SPRING TEA

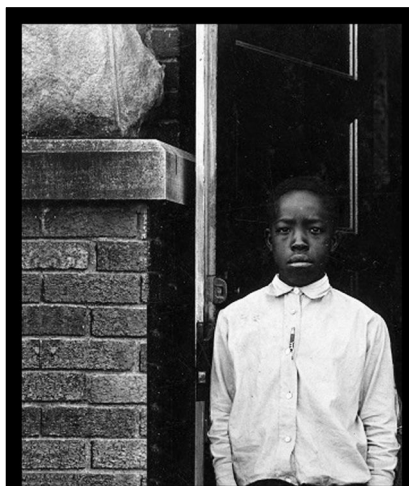

BLACK HISTORY OF CARMEL— NEW BOOK AVAILABLE

The Black history of Carmel predates the platting of the town by almost two decades. Before the pioneers settled the area, a Black man named Pete lived among the Lenape near the city's northeast side.



THE EARLY
BLACK HISTORY
OF CARMEL

In the decades that followed, many Black men, women and children escaped from their enslavers by traveling a line of the Underground Railroad operated by Quakers on Hamilton County's west side. Frederick Douglass, a leader in the abolitionist movement, visited the county in 1843 to speak against slavery.

Several freedmen and freedwomen made their homes in the Carmel area. Some came during the Antebellum Period. Others were part of an exodus from Southern states during Reconstruction.

In the early twentieth century, a Black family group settled in Clay Township. Their members included a veteran of World War I and Carmel High School's first Black graduate, who was also a track star. In the late 1940s, another Carmel track star became one of the fastest young men in the country.

Tidbits from our Facebook Page

Joseph Duffy was born in Georgia, on April 3, 1841. His family was enslaved by a Baptist minister named Rev. David Laney Duffey. In November 1864, the Union Army under the command of Gen. William T. Sherman began a military campaign called the “March to the Sea” in which the army ravaged towns and the countryside from Atlanta to Savannah in order to break the will of Southern people to continue the war. When the army reached the town of McDonough, Georgia, on November 18, Joseph entered the camp of the Twelfth Illinois Infantry and enlisted. Over the next six months, he marched one thousand miles through Georgia and the Carolinas. When the war was over, he marched in the large victory parade through Washington, D.C., called the Grand Review of the Armies.

In 1869, he married a woman named Sibbie Ann Richardson. She too had been born into slavery. About 1882, the family moved to the Mattsville neighborhood on Carmel’s east side. The Duffys rented a house along what is now Haverstick Road near Woodbrook Elementary. Joseph earned a living working on farms in the

neighborhood and on the county roads. His income was supplemented by a military pension.

Sometime before 1910, the Duffys moved to a farmhouse on Hazel Dell Parkway north of 106th Street. It was there that Sibbie Ann passed away in 1916. Joseph’s daughter Maggie, her husband George O’Neil, and their daughter Anna moved into the farmhouse and took care of him until he passed away in 1923. After his death, the O’Neils moved to Chicago, and the Duffys’ chapter in Carmel came to a close.

MESSAGE FROM OUR EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Resiliency—every person, family, and organization needs it to be successful. Carmel Clay Historical Society demonstrated it in 2022.

CCHS met a variety of challenges this year as we stayed focused on the construction of the Carmel Clay History Museum. This fall we prepared the site for construction by removing the small cottage from the south lot. We also temporarily relocated the historic Monon Depot to avoid any damage that might occur during the construction of the museum building. While we had concerns about moving the building, the move went smoothly, and the building is safer on the new temporary site.

Early in 2022, inflation impacted our museum project, and the construction bids exceeded our budget. Changes needed to be made. While the footprint of the original architectural plans remained the same, some modifications were made to the interior of the building to lower costs. Bids have been reposted, and we are again hopeful for groundbreaking in 2023.

In the interim, CCHS focused on fundraising through events and grants. We ended 2022 with a positive general fund balance due to a successful Holiday Home Tour, our first annual Great Squirrel Stampede, and especially to the generous donors who contributed to our Annual Campaign. In December, the Allen Whitehill Clowes Charitable Foundation generously awarded \$225,000 for programming in the new museum. Our capital campaign fundraising made gains in 2022 and will continue in 2023.

We will keep our eye on the prize with RESILIENCY, and we thank you for sticking with CCHS.

GRANTS

CCHS is grateful to the generous organizations that have supported us this year. The City of Carmel Arts Grant provided \$3,775 for an illustrated timeline that will be featured in the entry area of the new museum. The Indiana Historical Society provided a \$4,999 Heritage Support Mini Grant that was used to purchase storage materials for the City of Carmel Archives. We received a Regional Arts Partners Grant from the Indiana Arts Commission in the amount of \$3,899 that will fund a collaborative children’s mural with artist Jill Kniptash. We were also fortunate to receive a \$2,000 grant from Hamilton County Tourism to fund our Great Squirrel Stampede fun run in celebration of the county’s bicentennial and a \$500 grant to fund additional programming. Finally, we are grateful for a \$250,000 grant from the Allen Whitehill Clowes Charitable Foundation that will be used for programming in the new building.

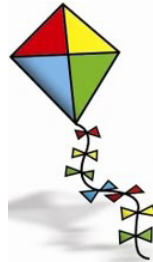
