

SPEAKER SERIES

We kicked off our Speaker Series on February 23 with "Roberts Settlement: Our Roots, Our Legacy," a presentation by Bryan Glover. Roberts Settlement was an African-American pioneer settlement established in 1835 in Jackson Township, Hamilton County. The first members of this community were free people who left North Carolina to ensure they remained free. Bryan gave us a fascinating look at the lives of those who built the community and their descendants.

On March 8, Jim Russell shared stories from his sixteen-year career as a sportswriter. Jim wrote and edited three Indiana publications, including The Indianapolis News. He later served as sports information director for the Indiana High School Athletic Association. He covered all the major sports stories in Indiana, and we were grateful he shared them with us!



Tidbits from our Facebook Page

Did you know that there is a connection between pioneer-era Clay Township and Roberts Settlement in Jackson Township?

Edmond and Caroline Hurley were the first Black landowners in Clay Township. Both were born into slavery in Kentucky but obtained their freedom and married in 1828. In 1840, they moved to Clay Township.

Edmond worked as a farm laborer and used his earnings to purchase land. In 1849, he bought 10 acres where the Estancia subdivision is today. In 1855, he purchased an adjoining 30 acres and sold the entire 40-acre lot for a large profit. The Hurleys moved to Roberts Settlement, where they established the Second Cicero Baptist Church. The Hurley cemetery is still there. You can find it near the southeast corner of the intersection of E. 276th Street and E. 33rd Street in Jackson Township.

Historically, Carmel people got things done with teamwork. The Monon Railroad was routed through Carmel because our residents welcomed this improvement for growth and helped to fund its construction. The Carnegie Library funding began with women working together through bake sales, quilting bees and stubborn determination to open that important educational facility. In the 1960s, a group of moms organized a tent sale to raise the initial funds for a community swimming pool along Guilford Road. Teamwork truly does make dreams work. GRANTS

CCHS is grateful to the generous organizations that have supported us this year. The City of Carmel Arts Grants from 2022 and 2023 provided \$6,792 for eight vintage-style illustrations of Carmel landmarks that will appear on the bulkhead in the lobby of the new museum. Hamilton County Tourism's grant of \$500 funded our Polar Express event. The Indiana Historical Society provided a \$25,000 Heritage Support Mini Grant that was used to fund moving expenses and archival storage supplies. We are grateful to Jim and Ginny Steckley for contributing a grant match of \$3,750 for moving expenses. The Indiana Arts Commission provided a Regional Arts Partner Grant of \$3,899 that funded a collaborative children's mural with artist Jill Kniptash. We were also fortunate to receive \$12,000 from Hamilton County Commissioners, the Clay Township Trustee and Board and the City of Carmel for last year's bicentennial celebration. These grants funded a trolley for the CarmelFest parade, lunch for Clay Twp. pioneer descendants, the production of Farms of Clay Township maps, a historical compilation of Carmel stories, and Carmel Clay Bicentennial Celebration and History Fair.
